August 11th Charter on Orient Star!

Well most of us drove through torrential rains in the wee hours of the morning to get out to Orient on Saturday August 11th, but the weather finally eased and we and left dock a half hr. later than scheduled and headed toward Montauk. We all put the foul weather gear to good use as we dropped down for the first time at the Frisbees around 845 in a light rain that would pop up intermittently during the morning. The fishing proved to be a bit slow early on as the first few fish were seabass and sea robins. On the second drift the tide slowed a bit on the last stages of the tide and more fluke were taken and a few nice ones hit the deck. Once the tide dropped and the boat didn't drift well, Capt. Dan brought us back towards the Radar just west of the lighthouse. We fished thru countless sea robins and some short fluke picking away at some keepers as well the rest of the day as we worked our way east and eventually ended up just out in front of the light house at the elbow. There were a few Sand sharks and Porgies that made an appearance as well as a mackerel and bluefish or two. The day ended with quite a few members having at least a couple of keeper fluke and a seabass or two as well as a few members who caught 6 keepers! Approximately 30 fluke made the trip back as fillets! For a day that started out soggy and with no hope ended up a fine day at the rail with calm seas and decent fishing! We got back to dock around 5pm as the captain gave us a true extended day!

Team Contest Rescheduled

The Expected team fluke contest on July 28th was discussed at our last meeting, and with the weather looking so/so with up to 4 ft seas, rain and fog in the forecast the decision was made to call off the event for that day and reschedule it for August 25th.

F.T.C. Shootouts!

We were officially awarded the win for the July shootout against the other clubs! Congratulations go out to all of us for fishing hard and keeping the Anglers relevant and respected by the other area clubs!

During the weekend of August 10-14th we participated in the second fluke shootout against those same clubs and due to our charter had a great combined weight of 15lb. 8 oz. If they didn't call the event due to weather we should be in fine shape after I speak with the Tuna club

December 7,8,9 striped bass (All events are weather permitting)

This is for bragging rights and no one is expecting cheating, nor do I expect cheating from any of our members. We want to win to show were a strong club, but the right way, so get out there and fish!
