# Fishing improving!

As I write this opening page, we have just had members report back on taking fluke to 6.6 lbs. locally on the deeper reefs, and. 13.6 lb. beast in Nantucket! Montauk has come alive as a limit catch was made by member John Lippi, who had a 5 lb. fish in that limit. Locally we are seeing more ling than I can remember in recent years while fluking at the reef, and surprisingly the seabass we all expected to be a nuisance haven't been too reliable to come by on a day by day basis in water shallower than 90 ft. Of course, there are the usual cast of skates and smooth dogfish on the Hempstead reef porgies are filtering into the shallower reefs such as Rockaway and the McCallister grounds and are in full force all over the north shore from Greenport to Manhasset. This all on the heels of one of the best Spring Striped bass runs we have had locally in the Debs/Jones area, and there is a good bite taking place on the north shore at this time. The giant bluefish we had early in the spring haven't been as easy to find but there are multi-tudes of cocktails which seem to rear their heads more frequently than not. The clean bait filled waters have led to many Thresher sharks being taken and being the prize winners at quite a few area shark tournaments, and the presence of blue sharks with the occasional keeper Mako keep the action fast and furious for those of us looking for some pelagic action not too many miles from home as the monster ledge area and the rockpiles as well as the Yankee, & Linda make any good weather window a worthwhile opportunity to tangle with a apex predator, a couple of white sharks are around also to make for excitement. On the club side of fishing, our first inter club event was on a breezy slow weekend and we caught keepers but didn't get any points for the end of year trophy, the effort was there and I'm sure we will do even better come the 8/10 and 11 Fluke event. Get out there and fish that's the best way to figure out the when's, where's, and how's to be successful.


