<u>August 11th charter on Orient Star!</u>

Our 2nd charter of the year will take place on August 11th on the Orient Star out of Orient point. We will be targeting Montauk Fluke and Seabass on this extended day trip . 6am-3/4 pm This is a better option for us as a club than driving the extra half hr. to Montauk and sitting in the late day traffic thru the Hamptons on the way home later in the day. Figure on just shy of 2 hr. drive for most of us to Orient by the Sea Marina. It is recommended that you arrive 40 -60 min before departure. We ask that members try to pack as lightly as possible as there isn't as very large cabin on this boat for gear. It is summer, and we expect many will want to be outside, so we are setting the limit at 20 for this excursion. The list is almost full, so we ask that members bring a deposit for holding your spot to our next meeting on July 24th.

There was a 6.38 caught by Ken Bell, a 5.8 lb. fish taken by Peter Baressi, a 3.75lb fish caught by Rico Ranieri inside the bay, and on Monday Sheila Patton took a nice 5.14 lb. fish that doesn't qualify for the inter club shootout but is in play for the club events like the rodeo and the associate yearly specie awards.

As of this writing, we have beaten FTC and are awaiting the results from the third club on the north shore, *it looks good that we have won this event!!* I will send out an email or announce it Tuesday at the meeting once I get word from Matinecock Rod and Gun.



Mike and Matt B. made the trek and had a nice day out at Orient with a few short Striped Bass, a Bluefish and a keeper 22-inch fluke for our efforts as we jigged the gut, bucktailed the Race and fluked at Gardiners. With only 6 people on the boat it was just like a private charter, fishing those waters are tough even on a perfect day off the moon, we had to use boat gear for bass and blues which was daiwa 400 h reels loaded with 80 lb. braid and Medium e glass rods, a challenge to hold and work for long periods of time.
